Mountain Shadow

14 – 30 November 24 Opening Celebration Thursday 14 November, 6 – 8pm

Hobie Porter's virtuosic paintings weave together personal history with sensitive and sublime visions of the landscape. Rendered with microscopic clarity, they speak of an essential yet elusive harmony between nature and culture.

In Porter's new collection, 'Mountain Shadow', sweeping panoramic landscapes pay homage to the mountains and escarpments of the artist's lifelong home in the Tweed Valley. Working with drone technology, a new aerial perspective sifts these familiar landscapes through an unfamiliar lens as Porter engages with the Freudian theory of the uncanny – where heimlich courts the unheimlich and reality dances with dreams. The drone, as both trope and tool, allows the artist to wilfully remove himself from reality, elevating his paintings into a disorienting, ethereal space. Notable here is a divergence from the floating object paintings for which Porter is known; the drone itself becomes the floating object, summoning a new perspective spatially and conceptually.

Porter's paintings address the sublime through a cinematic visual language. The epic panoramas in 'Mountain Shadow' see alpine trees illuminated with crisp, graphic light, sharpening the edges of forms and creating a sense of high definition. Porter's meticulous trompe l'oeil conjures a kind of augmented reality beyond the painterly – veering into the hyperreal. Meanwhile, the perspectival shift into high drone territory creates, for the first time, a tacit tone of science fiction. It's a fascinating marriage of sublimity, scientism and hyperreality, destabilising the viewer as feelings of awe collide with cinematic sci-fi and the uncanniness of Porter's photorealism. A symbolic exchange, perhaps, pointing towards both environmental catharsis and anthropogenic notions of loss. We see this in works such as *Nocturne*, where a temporal multiplication creates an augmentation of reality. Here, different times of day are imaged simultaneously – stark sunlight contouring the mountain, morning mists engulfing the valley below and the Milky Way stretching out across the night sky. The landscape observed through a cosmic, scientific lens, summoning notions of ecology, geology, and deep time.

Shadows and mists are purveyors of mystery and disorientation in these works, with Porter recruiting elements of the Australian Gothic. There are moments where the shadows of the rainforest canopy converge into dense black cavities, while phantomic fog engulfs the landscape like a revenant presence keeping watch over these ancient lands. "I enjoy painting mountains that are only partially visible" reflects the artist, "not only because of the optical challenges, but because they become charged with secrecy and unfamiliarity". Even for Porter, who has spent a lifetime living amongst this landscape, the mountains are charged with Gothic mystique. Voids of painterly information are becoming increasingly important to his visual language, stirring an evocative sway of revelation and concealment.

In addition to Porter's innovations in perspective and composition, some of his smaller works continue the floating object format endemic to his practice, however these objects are translucent, transient, fading into – rather than sitting on top of – the landscape. Endangered floral species overlay cultivated land as Porter considers the ramifications of habitat destruction. In *Ravine*, a dainty ravine orchid (which has nearly been poached into extinction) drifts amidst the mountains, a spectral presence from a soon-to-be past. There is a botanical tenor here, as if the artist is preserving in paint.

Porter regards these paintings as his most quiet to-date, yet paradoxically there is an eerie disquietude. "It has been a difficult process to let go of the way I have worked in the past," he admits. "There has been a shift away from over-arching narratives. It feels like an emptying of content has taken place to allow for stillness and space."
